

2 NYC firms relocating to Nassau County

The [Nassau County Industrial Development Agency](#) has approved economic incentives to two New York City companies that will relocate to Nassau and ultimately provide \$115 million in new economic benefits to the county.

[“R” Best Produce](#), a fruit and vegetable wholesaler now in the Bronx, has agreed to relocate to Port Washington and bring with it 51 new jobs, according to a statement. “R” Best is also expected to add 12 new positions within three years of its move. It is anticipated that the project will create 25 full-time construction jobs.

The IDA assisted “R” Best Produce in acquiring 99 Seaview Blvd., a 160,000-square-foot partly vacant industrial building for office and warehouse use.

[Display Technologies](#) will move from College Point, Queens, to Lake Success, bringing with it 61 jobs and a promise to create four additional jobs within three years. The move also will create 25 full-time construction jobs.

The company, which manufactures beverage displays used in supermarkets and convenience stores, will lease 24,000 square feet at 1111 Marcus Ave. for its headquarters and operations.

“These economic development compacts are proof that Nassau County can be competitive with other regions and is able to entice businesses to our county,” Nassau IDA Executive Director Joseph Kearney said. “These are absolute home runs for the county.”
