

Questions Received Related to NCIDA Requests for Statements of Qualifications:
(NCIDA responses appear below in italics)

1. Whether Statements of Qualifications may be submitted via e-mail?

NCIDA: No, the Requests for Statements of Qualifications require that Statements be submitted in a sealed envelope. Submissions may be made by certified or registered mail, overnight courier or in person.

2. With respect to the Request for Statements of Qualifications to Provide Certain “Clean Energy” Consulting Services (RFQ #2018-09), is the Agency considering splitting up the services among multiple vendors?

NCIDA: As set forth in the Request for Statements of Qualifications, the Agency will allow respondents to partner or subcontract with other persons or firms to provide the required services. All information required by the Agency with respect to the primary respondent is also required from partner or subcontract firms and persons.

3. With respect to the Request for Statements of Qualifications to Provide Certain “Clean Energy” Consulting Services (RFQ #2018-09), will the successful respondent be granted access to any proprietary database/GIS data of the Agency and/or the Long Island Board of Realtors to help develop the Clean Energy Development Plan?

NCIDA: No, the Agency does not have access to any such proprietary databases. If required to provide the requested services, the successful respondent shall be required to obtain access to any such databases at its own expense.

4. With respect to the Request for Statements of Qualifications to Provide Certain “Clean Energy” Consulting Services (RFQ #2018-09), will the Agency provide any guidance as to the level of detail desired for the Plan and other scope items? If not, any sense of a budget dollar amount for the requested services?

NCIDA: Respondents should use their professional judgment to determine the level of detail that they believe would be in the best interest of the Agency and make a cost proposal accordingly. Respondents should be aware that the Plan will include determining what County-owned sites (from a list provided by the Agency) would be available and suitable for renewable energy projects and that the successful respondent will be responsible for assisting in setting up a competitive process for the development of same.
